Research

"Inimitable, unique, scientific and spiritual legacy of our great ancestors should become a permanent program of action for us. We must hold on to this immortal property and draw strength and inspiration from it. And in accordance with these ideals, it is essential to develop, first of all, the national education system." [1] President Shavkat Mirziyoyev said during a solemn ceremony dedicated to October 1 – Teachers and Mentors Day at the International Congress Centre in Tashkent. The presidential press service noted that this is clear evidence that the issue of education and upbringing has risen to the level of a special priority.

In fact, enhancement of the education processes and organization of delivering modern education to the youth is one of the most topical issues nowadays. During the meeting dedicated to the further development of the education system, improving the sector of human capacity building and expanding the integration of science and technology with the manufacturing sector, which took on 24 October 2018, the President of Uzbekistan highlighted the issues related to integrating innovative methods to the process of education, providing consistency of the existing education curricula with manufacturing and production, and existing challenges associated with making the education system in line with the structural changes labor market demands is experiencing and mentioned "It is bothersome that instead of serving as an engine of national economic growth and development, our higher education system is lagging behind the global, contemporary level".

From the first days of his activity as President, Shavkat Mirziyoyev has paid particular attention to the issues of training modern creative-minded specialists, fostering the young people as patriotic and highly ethical personalities, as well as improving the education system to achieve these goals.

In the difficult years of the transition period, as it is known, the spiritual and educational environment in schools turned out to be vulnerable, the authority and prestige of the teaching profession declined, attention to the training of teachers of a new formation, the development of pedagogical science, and

the introduction of innovative learning technologies decreased, which led to a number of serious problems.

In recent years, large-scale reforms have been carried out to effectively address these shortcomings and to radically improve the training system. In particular, in accordance with the public education system, 6 decrees and resolutions of the President, 21 resolutions of the Cabinet of Ministers were adopted, and the legal framework for transformation in the sphere was strengthened.

Based on the wishes of parents and the general public, the 11-year school system was restored. Over the past three years, 157 new general schools have been built.

Schools of a new type were organized, including those for gifted children, and those named after the great scientists Mirzo Ulugbek and Muhammad al-Khorezmi, along with literary-creative schools named after Hamid Alimjan and Zulfiya, Erkin Vahidov, Abdulla Aripov, Ibraim Yusupov, Iskhokkhon Ibrat, Muhammad Yusuf, Halima Khudoyberdiyeva, as well as Temurbeklar Maktabi schools, Presidential and private schools, which remarkably enhanced access to education.

Given the importance of men's role in the education system, their participation in the effective pedagogical activities, 12 thousand 871 male teachers returned to schools as a result of specific encouragement packages taken.

Extensive work is also underway to stimulate the work of teachers. Over the past three years, their salaries have been increased by an average of 2.5 times. Clear criteria for motivating the work of teachers working in remote areas are defined; they are paid allowances of up to 50 percent. This facilitated the attraction of more than a thousand teachers to remote areas where there was a shortage of such specialists. Teachers who continue to work at retirement age are paid the full pension.

The President emphasized the urgent magnitude of forming a national idea based on the principle "From national revival to national prosperity", devising its deeply thought-out ideological foundations, as well as educating the young generation in the spirit of national pride and patriotism from childhood. Continuously, in our country, priority attention is given to improving the living and working conditions of women and solving their social problems. At the initiative of the President, large-scale work has begun in the country to strengthen the position of women in public and political life, organize support for their business initiatives, and expand opportunities for learning.

As our President said in the speech of the solemn ceremony dedicated to the International Women's Day:

"At present, women make up 77 percent of those employed in the health sector, education - 74 percent, economy and industry - 46 percent.

If in 2017 27 percent of women worked in the field of management, now this figure has reached 33 percent, in the ranks of political parties their number has increased from 40 to 47 percent, in entrepreneurship - from 21 to 37 percent.

About 2 thousand educated, enterprising, active women work in leadership positions in state and public organizations. Women make up 33 percent of the deputies of the Legislative Chamber of the Oliy Majlis, 25 percent of the members of the Senate and deputies of local Kengashes.

For great services to the Motherland and people, 17 women were awarded the highest state award - the title of Hero of Uzbekistan. Among the women of the country there are 5 academicians, more than 700 doctors of sciences and about 3 thousand candidates of sciences only in higher

educational institutions, many women were awarded honorary titles - People's Poet, People's Artist, People's Teacher of Uzbekistan and others.

For these purposes, more than 872,000 women were employed last year. Over 233,000 women were given loans for a total of 4 trillion 700 billion sums. More than 252,000 have learned professions and entrepreneurial skills that are in demand on the labor market.

Particular attention in the country is paid to the quality of education and upbringing of girls. Our outstanding educator Abdurauf Fitrat said: "The merit of mothers in the upbringing of all mankind is invaluable."

Indeed, when a girl studies, gets a higher education, masters a modern profession, the atmosphere in her family becomes completely different. For comparison, here are some facts: If six years ago 110,000 girls studied at universities, now this figure has increased by almost 5 times and amounts to 500,000. Thanks to this, the proportion of girls among students has reached 50 percent, which has never happened before in our history.

In accordance with the new procedure, more than 10,000 girls who entered the master's degree were paid by the state for tuition fees - a total of over 68 billion sums. More than 65,000 female students were provided with interest-free educational loans for almost 727 billion sums.

About 2,000 girls from needy families, as well as over 500 women with a five-year work experience in their specialty, entered universities on the basis of a separate quota.

Undoubtedly, such work, carried out by us despite the ongoing deep economic crisis in the world, will bear fruit, and no matter how difficult it may be, we find the necessary means and opportunities for this.

I am sure that the girls who study in higher educational institutions today will become political and public figures, prominent representatives of science, culture and art, and sports tomorrow" [3]

After all these support, women are very grateful to the government. This is very important when the state supports the rights, education, life of women and girls. Supporting women in Uzbekistan is increasing day by day. And we believe that the women of the Uzbekistan will be worthy for their nation in the future.

Continuously, innovations in the field of education in Uzbekistan are expanding very quickly, one of them is the transition to digital learning.

Uzbekistan has launched a higher education process management information system - HEMIS, which will allow the transfer of administrative, educational, scientific and financial areas into an electronic format. This was announced by the Minister of Higher and Secondary Specialized Education of Uzbekistan

"There will be no more paper journals and student records, student ones will be replaced with ID-cards" - the head of the Ministry of Higher Education.

As world practice shows, if the system is digitized and the human factor is minimized, then there will be no corruption, the head of the Ministry of Higher Education said. He stressed that as part of these measures, the Higher Education Process Management Information System (HEMIS) has already been launched, which made it possible to transfer administrative, educational, scientific and financial areas into electronic format.

"This gives openness, transparency, fairness, saves time, and most importantly, reduces costs," said Abdukodir Toshkulov and added that digitalization has the same impact on all processes. [4]

Accordingly, we see improvement in learning, students become more evolved, their advancement goes a lot quicker, as advancements help them save time on education. In this way, we accept that development is a need for each instructive establishment.
